Indifference map

- An indifference map is a set of indifference curves.
- Along an indifference curve (IC), the total utility of the respective combination of goods remains unchanged (constant).
- The **further away** an indifference curve is from the **origin**, the higher the total utility. IC 3 is therefore preferred to IC 2, and IC 2 to IC 1, because of the higher total utility.
